
VOTER'S MEETING is next



## A blessing is neither earned nor deserved but received.

"And all these blessings shall come upon you and overtake you, if you obey the voice of the Lord your God" (Deuteronomy 28:2). Likewise, life ensues as a gift indicating God's grace and a privilege affirming His favor. A blessing means speaking, a promise humbly hidden in simple words. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (John 20:29). Likewise, every life has promise and purpose, no matter what size, skills, or circumstances.

Blessed amounts to more than being merely happy, healthy, attractive, affluent, or influential. "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied" (Matthew 5:6). Likewise, every human life exceeds just physical functions and emotional assessments.

"So shall they put my name upon the people of Israel, and I will bless them" (Numbers 6:27).
