

We appreciate your support! We now have 15 new students in Burnsville since August 1st, and Shari is teaching the majority of them. Please volunteer if you can!



ADULT BIBLE STUDY We continue with the study of C.S Lewis's book *The Screwtape Letters*. It is a brilliant and satirical look at spiritual warfare and the dynamics of temptation. Screwtape, a senior demon in the bureaucracy of Hell, writes letters to his incompetent nephew



Wormwood, a junior devil. The younger demon's assignment is to corrupt a young man living in London during the tumultuous days of World War II. Using Scripture references, discussion questions, and related commentary, we will examine each letter through a Christian lens of morality, temptation, and good and evil. There are two equal and opposite errors into which our race can fall about the devils. One is to disbelieve in their existence. The other is to believe, and to feel an excessive and unhealthy interest in them. They themselves are equally pleased by both errors and hail a materialist or a magician with the same delight. Join the study if you haven't been here, discussion on these topics should be enriching for all.





Such as electronics of all types, fun alarm clocks, games, remote control vehicles, cameras, computer, IPod, PS2s, Xbox, hand-held games, Gameboy SP, GameCube or Nintendo games (less graphic violence) curling irons, flat irons, hair dryers, combs, brushes, nail care, grooming kits, toiletries, lotions, gift packs, jewelry, girl's age appropriate cosmetics, fashion hair items, jewelry boxes and other holders, headbands, creative arts of all sorts, i.e. jewelry making, drawing, face painting, card making, scrapbooking.
