

# FROM THE PASTOR

# And this will be a sign unto you, you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger. - Luke 2:12

Dear friends in Christ,

"Just follow the signs, you can't miss it." I've heard these famous words many times in our family travels throughout the midwest. The directions seemed so simple when they were first heard, but as we set out to find the signs which were to lead us to our destination, it soon would become obvious that these signs weren't as easy to interpret as we had supposed.

An example of this is the set of directions we were given on one of our trips: "Turn left at the tractor and turn right at the red barn" Now this may have been easy for someone familiar with these landmarks but not for someone new to the surroundings. As we progressed on, we passed tractors and red barns at almost every farm. But at which one were we supposed to turn?!? Only after stopping to inquire about these signs did we learn that the tractor was a tractor on a yellow warning sign which cautioned traffic to beware of slow tractor traffic on that part of the highway. And the barn...it wasn't a red barn on a farm but was a restaurant called "The Red Barn!" Now, when we travel these roads we can chuckle about our experience but we also know that if someone had not enlightened us about what these signs were, we would probably have driven right past the real signs without even giving them a second thought.

This Advent season, we also will travel on the road towards our destination in Bethlehem. God has graciously given directions to us in preparation and signs have been provided for us to follow during our journey. The journey won't always be pleasant because the Advent trek will call us to get in touch with the coldness and darkness of the sin in our lives - the things we do and should not, the things we do not and should. Advent will cause us to journey into the experience of our world's darkness - not only the longer nights but also the spiritual darkness, the

evil, the corruption and the injustice that surrounds us. While acknowledging our darkness, our hearts will be turned in preparation for the coming of our Lord. We will come to recognize the signs which our Lord has placed along this road for our behalf. Their significance and purpose will be revealed through the Word during the four Advent Sunday services.

Our signs this year will be are the signs found in the Old Testament prophecies. I pray that the meaning of these signs will touch your lives in ways that will comfort the anxieties and fears which arise when we think we're on this road of life alone. For these are the signs which will direct us to the hill country of Bethlehem where "the hopes and fears of all the years" have been met. Our journey will lead us to the manger of our Lord but it will also lead us to Jerusalem, six miles to the north, to the hill of Calvary, and to the empty tomb near the foot of this hill. It will lead us to the Mount of Olives where our Lord ascended into heaven.

During the Advent and Christmas seasons, we will journey seeking the signs which our Lord has placed along the road which give us the assurance of His guiding presence in our lives. In this we have a special incentive for being appreciative of God's love and for giving thanks. For our Heavenly Father has given us the gift which the signs reveal. The gift of His one and only Son, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, who the Father sent into this world, born of the virgin Mary and born under the law "to redeem those under the law, that we might receive the full rights of sons. Come, journey with us to Bethlehem and see this thing which has come to pass.

Give "Thanks to God for His indescribable gift."

## THE HEART OF STEWARDSHIP

"And it came to pass in those days that there went out a decree from Caesar Augustus..." is the way Luke's account of the Christmas story begins in chapter two (KJV). God offered up His best for us and in response we strive to offer our best to Him. # A WEEKDAY 2-MINUTE DEVOTION THAT HELPS YOU SEE JESUS AT WORK IN YOUR WORLD

#### **Carry**

The hike around the property was on the books for weeks. Saturday's sunshine allowed us to leave rain gear in the house. The property consists of just over 4 acres. Plenty of deer trails. Us involved me and two grandsons. 6 & 3. 70 years between the three of us.

Prep included explaining cacti and how to avoid them. Why you shouldn't pick up big rocks or move limbs (snakes). What to do when I say, "Stop!"

The speech so motivating that as we stepped off the walkway into the high grass, the 3-year-old announced, "I'd rather stay home." Visions of prickly pear that attack you and snakes that bite you as you push through grasses taller than you created more fear than excitement.

We overcame the concern by conducting a hybrid hike: part carry, part walking. A combo of "Hold me" and "I want to go first." Caution isn't meant to erode confidence. Or destroy courage.

Not all fear is bad. Fearing God provides a cornerstone for wisdom. Grasping your place in relation to The Creator's simply makes good sense.

Grasses higher than our heads covering trails previously unhiked cause us to hang back. Never leave home. Fail to experience new situations and beautiful scenery.

When I knelt down to encourage the youngest to not turn back, I realized just how high the grasses were. Just how scary the view appeared.

God sending Jesus to hike the world with us means God gets our perspective. He's seen the world through our eyes. He knows how to walk sideways through cactus paths. How to use a long stick to move a log that's in the way.

How tall grasses can't hurt you. They just appear scary when you're short. Nothing we face is foreign to Jesus. Nothing we face is beyond His rule.


And when you're really not sure about the journey you're on? About if you can go forward or not? He'll carry you until you're ready to walk on your own.

# LCMS STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY - DECEMBER 2023

#### The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regulation no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in

the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?
